What is the Regional Forum?

The Regional Forum is a panel of Southlanders, being set up as part of the People, Water and Land Programme – *Te Mana o te Tangata, te Wai, te Whenua*. This programme is a partnership between Environment Southland and Te Ao Marama (the environmental arm of Ngāi Tahu ki Murihiku).

The Regional Forum will advise Environment Southland's council and Te Ao Marama board members (Governance) on the methods to achieve the communities' values and objectives for freshwater. It will consider the policies and rules as well as the onground initiatives required to make change. Those considerations must include setting limits (e.g. water quality and quantity).







Who will be on the forum?

The Regional Forum will be a community-based group that reflects the diversity of our region. Members will be capable, open-minded, able to work as part of a team and passionate about Southland and the legacy we leave for future generations.

It will have an urban/rural balance, a broad geographic distribution, and a defined role for tangata whenua to reflect the principles of the Treaty of Waitangi.

What will the forum do? What are the key issues/questions that it will consider?

The forum will take the information gathered from the community about how they value water and consider the options available to achieve the communities' objectives (which includes setting limits).

The forum will work through the options and talk more with Southland communities as these are developed. There will be assessments before the forum puts forward options to Governance.

It is anticipated this work will require meeting for two days every three months (or more as required), with completion expected by 2022.
