#### MAY IT PLEASE THE COURT

- This Memorandum of Counsel is filed on behalf of the Southland Regional Council (**Council**) in respect of the appeals against the Council's decision on the proposed Southland Water and Land Plan (**pSWLP**).
- In accordance with the Court's Minute issued on 5 August 2019, this Memorandum provides a response, on behalf of the Council and a number of other parties, to the direction at [15(a)] of the Minute, being that:

by Friday 9 August 2019 the parties are to confirm whether the dates identified by the court are suitable, or if not advise which alternative dates in the week commencing 2 September are suitable. At the same time, the parties are to advise the Registry how many attendees will be at each meeting;

- To assist the Court by providing a consolidated response, Counsel sought responses from the parties to the Court's direction. In summary, the Court's proposed dates for conferencing, being 3 and 4 September 2019, are suitable to the parties that responded to Counsel for the Council.
- 4 Based on the responses received from those parties (plus the Council), there will be:
  - (a) 41-46 attendees at the first facilitated meeting (comprising Counsel, scientific, cultural, and planning advisors); and
  - (b) 12-14 attendees at the second facilitated meeting (comprising scientific advisors).
- For completeness, a table showing the individual parties' responses is contained in **Appendix A**. There is some overlap in the attendees for some parties (i.e., some people will be representing two parties). The total numbers provided in paragraph 4 reflect this overlap.
- In addition to the responses detailed in Appendix A, Counsel also received the following comments from parties:
  - (a) The Oil Companies are interested in the outcomes but will not be represented at the meetings in September.

- (b) Ballance wishes to note that it understands that the scope of these meetings will be solely on the question of degradation.
- (c) The Dairy Interests (Fonterra and Dairy NZ) understand that all primary sector parties consider that the proposed programme of work should be limited to determining whether particular waterbodies are degraded or not (by reference to indicators of health) and not - at this stage - the extent to which a waterbody should be improved or maintained. Horticulture NZ supported this view.
- Accordingly, based on the responses received from the parties, Counsel confirms that the dates identified by the Court of 3 and 4 September 2019 are suitable for the two facilitated meetings.
