



Possum control is the landowner's responsibility. Let Environment Southland staff assist you to manage possums and other pest animals on your property.



Possum Control Areas (PCA)

Possum control is landowner responsibility. Being part of a PCA allows landowners to work together to control possums in their area.

Environment Southland can provide access to possum control bait, bait stations and traps, as well as best practice advice.

If necessary Environment Southland implements the initial possum control throughout the PCA, to reduce possum numbers to a low level that landowners can then effectively manage and maintain.

Biosecurity staff can have bait stations set up in areas of prime possum habitat and these bait stations can then be used for ongoing control. Staff will liaise with landowners about when they need to do their ongoing possum control work.

Using contractors is recommended as it ensures bait stations are used to their best advantage and Environment Southland provides possum bait and materials at very discounted rates to those involved in a PCA.

Why is a PCA established?

Environment Southland is likely to establish a PCA when:

- A TBfree vector control programme has been in place and has now stopped.
- A possum problem is known to exist or numbers are increasing
- Landowners seek possum control advice and assistance from Environment Southland

What are the benefits of a PCA?

There are many benefits in controlling possums on your property including:

- Preventing economic loss to crops, pasture and trees.
- Improved biodiversity.
- · Limiting the risk of TB.
- Ensuring a coordinated approach to possum control.
