Notes on transferring discharge permits

The Resource Management Act 1991 states that the holder's interest in a discharge permit cannot be transferred:

- to any person other than an owner or occupier of the site in respect of which the permit is granted or to a local authority; or
- from site to site.

A discharge permit will therefore generally be held by:

- 1 any person whose interest in the land is sufficient to enable that person to unconditionally deal with or dispose of it – generally, any person who in terms of land law is not necessarily the registered proprietor;
- 2 the registered proprietor;
- 3 the lessee for a term of not less than 12 months;
- 4 the lessee/licensee of Crown land;
- 5 any person with an interest by way of written agreement to purchase either the freehold leasehold; and
- 6 the permanent resident (inhabitant occupier).

In the case of a dairy farm, the consent for dairy effluent disposal will generally be held by:

- the landowner; or
- a lessee for a term of not less than 12 months;
- a sharemilker where the sharemilking agreement is for a term of not less than 12 months, and specifically requires the sharemilker to be responsible for the maintenance and operation of the effluent disposal system.
