Schedule of Conditions

General conditions

1. This consent authorises the discharge of contaminants into or onto land arising from the land use activity authorised by Land Use Consent AUTH-20242761-03 and shall be exercised in conjunction with that consent.
2. This consent does not authorise the discharge of contaminants directly to water as a result of the activity.
3. The discharge to land activity authorised by this consent must not result in:

- (a) the production of any conspicuous oil or grease films, scums or foams, or floatable or suspended materials,
- (b) any conspicuous change in the colour or visual clarity,
- (c) any emission of objectionable odour,
- (d) the rendering of freshwater unsuitable for consumption by farm animals, or
- (e) any significant adverse effects on aquatic life,

in any river, lake, artificial watercourse, modified watercourse or wetland.

Mitigation

4. Intensive winter grazing shall not occur on any part of the land holding.

Advice note: *Intensive winter grazing is defined as the grazing of stock between May and September (inclusive) on forage crops (including brassica, beet and root vegetable crops), excluding pasture and cereal crops.*

Review of consent

5. The Consent Authority may, in accordance with Sections 128 and 129 of the Resource Management Act 1991, serve notice on the Consent Holder of its intention to review the conditions of this consent during the period 1 February to 30 September each year, or within two months of any enforcement action being taken by the Consent Authority in relation to the exercise of this consent, for the purposes of:
- (a) Determining whether the conditions of this permit are adequate to deal with any adverse effect on the environment, including cumulative effects, which may arise from the exercise of the permit, and which it is appropriate to deal with at a later stage, or which become evident after the date of commencement of the permit;
 - (b) Ensuring the conditions of this consent are consistent with any National Environmental Standards Regulations, relevant plans and/or the Environment Southland Regional Policy Statement;
 - (c) Adding or adjusting compliance limits;
 - (d) Ensuring the Aparima Freshwater Management Unit meets the freshwater objectives and freshwater quality limits set in an operative regional plan or National Policy Statement for Freshwater Management; and
 - (e) Requiring the Consent Holder to adopt the best practicable option to remove or reduce any adverse effect on the environment arising as a result of the exercise of this permit.
