WHAT INVERTEBRATES ARE IN OUR WATERWAYS?

▶ What you need:

- 2 white containers (ice cream tubs work great!
- A kitchen sieve
- A tablespoon
- Gumboots
- Critter identification card: https://niwa.co.nz/sites/niwa.co.nz/files/A3_ SHMAK_guide.pdf
- Magnifying glass (optional)
- Data recording sheet (optional)

Q What to do:

- 1. Find a shallow creek. Take a minute to look at what's around. What can you see?
- 2. Fill your two containers half-full with stream water and place on the bank.
- 3. Carefully stand in the stream. Turn so you're facing downstream.
- 4. Keep your feet in one place and do the twist! Move the stones on the bottom of the stream.
- 5. As you see the murky water emerge, dip your sieve into the water and scoop towards you.
- 6. Empty the contents gently into the container and leave to settle.
- 7. Remove any twigs, leaves and rocks.
- 8. Using the spoon, carefully collect the critters and transfer them to the other container. (This will help you see them easily).
- 9. Use the identification cards to work out what critters you have in your waterway.
- 10. Remember to put the bugs back in the water after you have finished identifying them.
