MAY IT PLEASE THE COURT

This Memorandum of Counsel is filed on behalf of the Southland Regional Council (**Council**) in respect of the appeals against the Council's decision on the proposed Southland Water and Land Plan (**pSWLP**).

1

- As directed by the Court in its Minute dated 30 April 2019, the Council is to file a cross-examination schedule including estimates of the time each party requires for cross-examination of witnesses, and an allowance for court questions for each witness.¹
- The Council was also directed to file an updated order of parties and schedule of witnesses.²
- The Court also directed the Council to respond to the Court's suggestion that the Council have an additional opportunity to give further evidence at the end of the other parties' evidence.³

Hearing schedule - order of parties and schedule of witnesses

- The Court directed, in its Minute dated 30 April 2019, that the hearing schedule that was previously filed with the Court on 2 April 2019 setting out the order of parties and schedule of witnesses⁴ (and subsequently confirmed by Counsel for the Council on 26 April 2019) be updated to remove the Oil Companies.⁵
- 6 Counsel for the Council has updated the hearing schedule as directed.
- Counsel for the Council has also amended the hearing schedule to reflect with the Court's directions in relation to opening and closing submissions, cross examination, and Court questions. A single comprehensive schedule allowing time for opening and closing submissions, cross examination, and Court questions is attached to this Memorandum as **Appendix A**.
- 8 Counsel for the Council notes that while it has endeavoured to provide an accurate date for when each party can expect its witnesses to

appear, the days included in the schedule are indicative only due to the uncertain nature of the length of cross-examination (noting the Court's directions that the time estimations are to be respected except with leave) and Court questions, length of parties' closings, and any administrative issues that may arise throughout the hearing. Counsel has taken account of lunch and tea breaks when determining which days parties are likely to appear.

Cross-examination schedule

- In its Minutes dated 5 April and 30 April 2019, the Court directed the Council to confer with the other parties and confirm the witnesses required for cross-examination, noting the party (and counsel) seeking to cross-examine each witness. The Council was directed to provide this information by Friday 24 May 2019.
- The Court also directed in its Minute dated 30 April 2019 that all parties are to provide an informed estimate of the time required for each witness to be cross-examined.⁷ The Court expects that this estimate will be respected, save in extraneous circumstances, such as the Court finding a witness uncooperative, where leave to extend cross-examination may be sought.
- Notwithstanding this, Counsel for Fish & Game, Aratiatia Livestock Limited, and Meridian Energy Limited noted that the estimates given for cross-examination of Council witnesses may need to alter slightly due to the parties' estimates being provided prior to the Council's rebuttal evidence being filed.
- 12 Counsel for the Council conferred with the parties, requesting that they each confirm which witnesses they intend to cross-examine, which counsel will be cross-examining which witness, and the estimated time required for this cross-examination by 5pm on Wednesday 22 May 2019.
- 13 Counsel for the Council reminded all parties who had not responded of this deadline on Thursday 23 May and Friday 24 May 2019 and asked that if those parties wished to cross-examine any witnesses that they

- advise as soon as possible. No further cross-examination estimates were received.
- 14 Counsel notes that it did not receive a response from the following parties regarding their cross-examination intentions:
 - (a) Robert Kempthorne
 - (b) Peter Chartres
- As noted in paragraph 7 above, Counsel for the Council has prepared a comprehensive schedule, which includes the witnesses required for cross-examination, the party (and counsel) seeking to cross-examine each witness, the estimated time required for this cross-examination, and indicative days/dates. This comprehensive hearing schedule is attached as **Appendix A**.

Closing submissions for Council

- As noted in the Minute dated 30 April 2019, parties may give a closing submission at the end of evidence called in support of their appeal or, with leave of the court, at the end of the hearing.⁸
- 17 Counsel respectfully considers that it is appropriate for the Council to give its closing submissions at the end of the hearing given the Council's evidence is being heard at the start of the hearing. It will also allow Counsel to provide its closing in light of the evidence and cross-examination of other parties' witnesses.
- Accordingly, Counsel for the Council respectfully seeks leave for closing submissions for the Council to be given at the end of the hearing.

Further evidence from Council following all other parties' evidence

- In its Minute dated 30 April 2019, the Court directed the parties to confer and respond regarding the Court's proposal that the Council be provided an additional opportunity to present further evidence, at the end of the evidence, to respond to any matters arising during the hearing (due to the hearing proceeding in the order of parties and not specialist topics).
- Counsel asked the parties to advise their views on the Court's proposal.

 The views of the parties who responded are set out below.

- 21 Counsel for Aratiatia does not oppose the Court's proposal, provided other parties have an opportunity to cross-examine on any evidence relevant to its interests.
- 22 Counsel for Meridian considers that the evidence exchange timetable allowed sufficient opportunity for the Council to present any evidence it considered relevant. In the event that, as a consequence of what transpires at the hearing, the Court seeks additional evidence on a particular topic, Counsel for Meridian expects that the Court would adopt a process that ensured fairness to all parties by allowing an opportunity to consider and respond to that evidence. However, if the Council wishes to produce new evidence outside of a direction from the Court, Counsel for Meridian considers that the Council should make an application to do so explaining the reasons why such further evidence is required. Counsel for Meridian considers that, if the Court were to grant leave to the Council to produce further evidence, it will need to establish a process that gives other parties a fair opportunity to consider and respond to that evidence.
- Counsel for the Director-General of Conservation is not opposed to the Court's proposal, however it is concerned about the potential scope of this further evidence, and whether it is evidence which should be anticipated and provided through the rebuttal process. If Council considers there is a need to call further evidence to respond to a matter arising during the hearing, Counsel for the Director-General of Conservation would prefer that the need for further evidence, and the parameters of that evidence, be discussed at the hearing.
- 24 Ballance Agri-Nutrients Limited has no issue with the Court's proposal.
- Forest & Bird does not support the Court's proposal. It considers that further evidence from the Council should only be provided for, with the Court's leave, where the Council has shown that the matter that its witness would be responding to is a new matter that has not been addressed in the evidence.
- Subject to Court directions, Counsel for the Council does not at this stage anticipate a requirement to present further evidence at the end of the evidence of other parties.
- 27 However, if the Court considers it necessary / desirable for the Council to provide evidence in response to matters raised throughout the

hearing, the Council will do so, and notes that, in the interest of fairness, parties should be given an opportunity to consider and cross-examine any further evidence that is presented.

Order of cross-examination

- Counsel for the Council notes that the Court has not issued directions as to the order of parties for cross-examination.
- Counsel suggests that a logical order would be to have the Council as the first to cross-examine each witness (where it wishes to do so), followed by any appellants, and then any s 274 parties.

Witnesses where no party intends to cross-examine

- Counsel for the Council notes that there are a number of witnesses that no party intends to cross-examine. Counsel for the Council seeks directions from the Court in relation to the attendance of any witness that will not be cross-examined, specifically:
 - (a) Does the Court have any questions for those witnesses in Appendix A that will not be cross-examined?
 - (b) Will the Court be taking each witness' evidence as being read?
 - (c) Will the witnesses that will not be cross-examined, and for whom the Court does not have any questions, be expected to attend the hearing (if the Court will be taking their evidence as read)?
- If the Court were inclined to excuse those witnesses from attending the hearing, Counsel for the Council proposes that a suitable arrangement for those witnesses could be for them to provide the Court with a signed version of their evidence.
- Counsel for the Council considers that this approach would not prejudice any party and would be beneficial in the interests of time and costs.

Hearing time

- Counsel for the Council notes that, based on the updated hearing schedule (contained in **Appendix A**), two weeks appears to be insufficient time to complete the hearing.
- In estimating the total scheduled time for completing the hearing,

 Counsel has allowed a nominal time of 30 minutes per party for closing submissions. Counsel notes that this is for the purposes of our

- calculations of the estimated hearing time only and does not purport to limit the time parties have for closing submissions.
- Counsel also notes that in estimating the hearing time, some assumptions have been made regarding overlap of cross-examination which should reduce the required days, compared to the cumulative total that appears in the hearing schedule in Appendix A.
- Counsel notes the advice from the Court that, if required, the Court has capacity to hear the remainder of the hearing on Monday 17 June to Thursday 20 June 2019. Accordingly, Counsel has scheduled some witnesses to appear during this additional period of time (noting that the days set out in the hearing schedule are indicative only).
- However, Counsel for the Council have an existing High Court appeal set down to be heard in Christchurch on Monday 17 June 2019.
- In light of this, Counsel for the Council respectfully seeks that, if additional time is required for the hearing, the hearing be adjourned for Monday 17 June 2019 and instead resume on Tuesday 18 June 2019.

Directions sought

- 39 As set out above, Counsel respectfully seeks the following directions:
 - (a) that closing submissions for the Council to be given at the end of the hearing;
 - (b) that the Court address the following questions:
 - (i) Does the Court have any questions for those witnesses in Appendix A that will not be cross-examined?
 - (ii) Will the Court be taking each witness' evidence as being read?
 - (c) that the Court issue directions as to the attendance of witnesses where they are not being cross-examined and the Court does not have guestions for them; and

(d) if additional time is required for the hearing, the hearing be adjourned for Monday 17 June 2019 and instead resume on Tuesday 18 June 2019.
